

Your health insurance coverage abroad

A whole year away from home

If you plan to stay abroad for more than eight weeks, the VSAPlus tariff provides full coverage for up to one year – whether you are abroad for work, studies, or an extended vacation.

Maximum entry age for policy commencements from January 1, 2025 is 59 years.

Up to 9 years of coverage with full flexibility

For stays abroad of up to nine years, the LR.1 tariff provides reliable protection. It can be taken out for an initial period of up to three years and extended twice for an additional three years each time. Your employer may also contribute to the premiums.

Stays abroad

Compulsory nursing care insurance during stays abroad

Your compulsory nursing care insurance remains unchanged if:

- you maintain your residence or habitual place of stay in Germany.
- you are employed abroad for a limited period due to the nature of your work or based on contractual arrangements.

If these criteria do not apply to you, you can still continue your compulsory nursing care insurance on a voluntary basis and thereby secure additional advantages.

Advantages of voluntarily continuing your compulsory nursing care insurance

- When you return, your premium remains unchanged and no new risk assessment is required.
- Waiting periods accrued abroad are credited.

In general:

You may receive benefits (nursing care allowance) during your stay abroad if you are in a member state of the EU or in Liechtenstein, Iceland, Norway, or Switzerland.
